Hello Everyone

I hope this finds you all well and warm, as we embark on what is often the coldest month of the year, considering those bitter south westerly winds!

Chairman Andrew Douglas Speaking of cold, it was great to see that our residents and their families enjoyed their Christmas in July festivities last week.

With families unable to attend the facility over the Christmas period last year due to our lockdown, it was great that they were able to share the fun with their loved ones this time.

On a different note, and as many of you would be aware, the Board and Management Team have recently had to make the tough decision to introduce a nominal patient contribution for services delivered by our Doctors in the Medical Centre.

This will mean that, from 1 September 2021, some patients will be required to pay a small fee when they have a consultation with their GP. Pension Concession Card holders and Children 16 years and younger, will continue to be fully bulk billed.

Being a community-based, not-for-profit organisation that receives limited government

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funding, these changes are necessary for us to continue providing high quality health care to members of our local community.

The cost of providing high quality health care services in a regional location has been increasing for several years and is expected to continue to rise. Faced with the same financial realities, the vast majority of medical practices have, for a number of years already, been charging for consultations - some in excess of \$75 per visit, for shorter consultations than we offer. However, we have endeavoured to keep our fee increase to an absolute minimum.

In so doing, we thank our patients and community in anticipation of their understanding and trust they will support this change to protect the ongoing viability of our local medical services.

To matters managerial, with Brad (General Manager) currently being on a hard-earned break for a few weeks, Louise (Finance Manager) is relieving in the 'top job' until he returns. Through this time, please feel free to contact Louise with any queries you might ordinarily direct to Brad. Similarly, Heather (Director of Nursing) is also on a well-earned break for a couple of weeks, with Judy O'Leary kindly relieving in her role in her absence. Thank you to both Louise and Judy for taking on higher duties through this period.

Finally, due to the impending retirement of a number of long-serving Directors, the Board is currently calling for expressions of interest from suitably qualified and experienced professionals to join the board as Non-Executive Directors. After many years of fully bulk billing within the Medical Centre we have made the difficult decision to introduce some modest fees for some patients. This step has not been taken lightly and is a vital part in ensuring continuity and sustainability of medical services to Clifton. Further information later in this newsletter. From **1 September 2021**, we will introduce a contribution payment for **some** patients at each visit.

This will help us retain experienced medical staff and allow us to continue to provide our local medical services amidst rising costs.

We have kept the contribution payment to the absolute minimum.

Pensioner Concession Card Holders People 70 years and over Children 16 years and under **No change. Fully bulk billed services remain.**

Health Care Card Holders \$10.90 (standard visit) \$14.25 (long visit)

All other patients \$20.90 (standard visit) \$24.25 (long visit)
