Since last Newsletter we have held our Annual General Meeting which was very well attended, showing strong community support for your locally owned, Community Based, Health Services Cooperative.

On the evening and in our published annual report, I expressed my appreciation to all the team that make Clifton Community Health Services such a special place. I again take this opportunity to say thank you to everyone who plays a part in the smooth running of our not for profit organisation.

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Substantial progress has been made on the Memory Support Household Project with the building almost at lock-up stage and work commencing on the external areas including the shed and BBQ gazebo. We are still working with Council on the connection of the building to the towns sewerage system and the construction of the link that will join the wing to the current Clifton Nursing Home. We are actively seeking funding and community support to assist in the fit-out of the building, we have been overwhelmed by the levels of support, however more is needed. Thank you also to all those who organised, arranged, supported and attended the Fundraising Art & Photography Auction fundraiser, \$7000 was raised towards the fit-out costs of the Memory Support Unit. I specially would like to thank Volunteer Eleanor who came up with and developed the concept with the help of a dedicated team of supporters, Thank you one and all.

After four years as Chairman of the Cooperative, this year I have decided that it was time for me to step down as Chair and give another Director the opportunity, so whilst I remain a Director on the Board I am pleased to advise that at the November Board Meeting, Mr Chris Bazley was elected as Chairman and Mr Andrew Douglas was elected as Deputy Chairman. I wish them both well in their new roles and look forward to working with them as we continue the journey to expand and improve on the services we provide for our community.
