Well, once again, not the end of the year or the fresh beginning to 2022 that we were looking for, although in my opinion, entirely

predictable with the removal of border and other restrictions. In late December we were elevated to Moderate Risk Level with regards to PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) use across the complex and this was elevated to High Level PPE use a few weeks into January 2022.

The Federal Government announced on Christmas Eve that Rapid tests would be provided to all Residential Aged Care organisations and that delivery would commence on 4th January 2022. We commenced following up on the 4th January and unfortunately at the time of writing

are still yet to receive any of the Govt Supplied tests or receive any word on a possible delivery date.

That said we had earlier in the second half of 2021 secured our own small supply (at great cost) at we have been using these sparingly to risk manage each potential situation on a case by case basis. Through all of this we have managed to so far remain open for visitors and I want to thank all of you for your continued cooperation with our entry protocols, mask and other requirements and not attending when you are unwell or are a potential close contact of a case (under whichever definition applied at the time)

Towards the end of the year we managed three great Covid-19 safe Christmas parties and I wish to thank everyone who played a part in creating these positive memories for residents, patients and staff.

Our wider circle is already experiencing positive Covid cases and unfortunately it is perhaps only a matter of time before we have it within the centre, keep working with us, and together we can continue to make a difference. Brad




Clifton Dabblers for assisting with the Christmas gifts for the residents' families who attended the Christmas Parties.
