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
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## **Residents' Round-Up**

With development & Building approvals in place we are awaiting a final decision from Council on the waiver of the infrastructure fees for this important community project.

Projected Costs for this project have now exceeded our original project Budget, so we will be looking for strong community support later in the year to make sure that we can deliver a Building that we can all be proud of and one that will serve the Community of Clifton for many years to come.

As Heather has outlined in her column we hosted the team from the Australian Aged Care Quality Agency with very positive results, congratulations to the whole team for this great effort.

Following on the success of our Solar Power Generation Project for the Main Complex we are in the process of selecting the successful company to install a system to assist with the Energy consumption requirements of the Medical Centre.
